1. Voter casts his/her vote using touch-screen computer.
2. At the end of the vote, computer prints out voter's choices which voter proofreads against his/her sample ballot (the names of candidates and propositions voted for must be printed out too, in abbreviated form). This "hard copy" printout is the voter's official ballot. It is on one 8.5" x 11" page.
3. Voter hands it facedown to precinct worker who, together with voter, deposits it in ballot box just as we do with punch cards today.
4. At the end of the day the electronic vote is instantly sent to the county level and announced as a preliminary vote. The printouts are boxed up and sent to the county for reading immediately.
5. At the county level, the printouts are fed through OCR (Optical Character Recognition) readers for tabulation. The "hard copy" count made by the OCR scanner has to be identical to the count reported by the electronic vote announced earlier. If there is a difference a hand count can be made. The "hard copy" ballot always trumps the electronic tabulation. In the event of a significant difference in totals, copies of all relevant evidence is turned over to representatives of the losing party for checking the accuracy of printouts and computer programs.
6. For the immediate future (while waiting for OCR systems to be put together) we can at least demand that all electronic voting devices produce a hard copy printout that the voter proofreads and inserts into a locked ballot box.

1. Instant tabulation.
2. No possible chad or punch card mess-ups.
3. No massive printing of punch cards – only one sheet is printed for each voter, and it is printed on cheap blank paper.
4. Multiple languages are available instantly with no pre-printed voting paper necessary.
5. This system immediately exposes election-tampering (stuffing of ballot boxes) or tabulation errors, because the "hard copy ballot" acts as a check against stuffed boxes or "program glitches" and allows meaningful hard copy recount.
